### The 66th Annual General Meeting:

The 66<sup>th</sup> Annual General Meeting of Indian Institute of Public Administration, Maharashtra Regional Branch, Mumbai was held virtually on Monday, the 15<sup>th</sup> November, 2021 at 3.00 pm onward. Shri Swadheen Kshatriya, IAS (Retd.) Hon. Chairman, IIPA/MRB presided over the meeting.

The proceedings of the meeting were conducted as per the agenda. The gist of the meeting is as follows:

1) To Condole the demise of Shri Jayaraman N., IAS (Retd.) IIPA Life Member L-3733

The committee noted with deep sorrow, the sad demise of the Shri Jayaraman N., IAS (Retd.) Life Member of IIPA and also the then secretary of IIPA/MRB during the period from 1987-1988 to 2000-2001 and paid homage to departed soul by observing one- minute silence.

### Prelude Conference 2021:

Indian Institute of Public Administration, Maharashtra Regional Branch, had organized virtual conference on "Building Atmanirbhar Bharat with Atmavishwas: Strategic Role of Technology and Innovation" on 18<sup>th</sup> November, 2021. The virtual conference was addressed by a legendary person Dr. Raghunath Anant Mashelkar, FRS, National Research Professor.

Shri Swadheen Kshatriya, IAS, (Retd.) Hon. Chairman, IIPA/MRB & State Chief Commissioner, Right to Public Services, Maharashtra State presided over the conference. He welcomed the guest speaker and participants & also introduced the guest speaker.

Dr. Mashelkar made very detailed presentation. He began his presentation by talking about changing face of science, technology & innovation in India. He said early 30's it was all about individual excellence. Then post-independence we had no foreign exchange & technology. We had to develop everything from pin to missile and we did that. As we grew in strength, we realized that the technology is not going to be available for money. We have to do this on our own right from space, defense to atomic energy. And then in 1991, we opened up to global competition. We realized that import substitution, copying reverse engineering will not do. We have to be innovative, creative and enter the global competition.

While summing up he said that what is important is that we have to bring the benefits of Innovations to the society. For that technology & policy have to come together. Technology plus bold policy can make the difference. That is what is going to matter in future. Finally we want to create an Atmanirbhar Bharat with assured resilience & that will come when we have that technology indicators fully integrated and resilience because adaptability, agility and resilient thinking is going to be more & more important. I am confident that we can create Atmanirbhar Bharat and that atmavishwas coming from our own capacity and India will be ahead of the world.

### Lectures/Meetings etc.:

Webinar on "Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojna"

Webinar on "Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojna", the topic suggested by IIPA, New Delhi, was organized virtually on 30.6.2021. Shri Surendranath Tripathi, I.A.S (Retd.) D.G. IIPA, New Delhi gave the opening remarks. Shri Swadheen Kshatriya, IAS, (Retd.) the Hon. Chairman, IIPA/MRB. welcomed the audience & gave brief information about IIPA/MRB. Theme introduction was done by Dr. Vinod Sharma, Senior Professor, Disaster Management, IIPA, New Delhi. Senior officers of State Government viz. Shri Debashish Chakrabarty, Additional Chief Secretary and Development Commissioner, Planning Department, Shri Anoop Kumar, the then Principal Secretary, Co-operation & Marketing, Smt. Vinita Vaid Singhal, Principal Secretary, Labour, Shri Eknath Dawale, the then Secretary, Agriculture participated in the discussions. They made comprehensive presentation about the implementation of the different components under

the "Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojna" in the State of Maharashtra & how the scheme has benefited the vulnerable sections of the society during the Covid-19 pandemic situation. Shri Suraj Mandhare, Collector & District Magistrate Nashik gave brief account of actual implementation of the scheme on the ground level. D.G. IIPA complimented for the successful implementation of the scheme and the positive handling of the Covid pandemic situation in Maharashtra.

### Yashwantrao Chavan Annual Memorial Lecture:

Due to Covid-19 pandemic situation and the consequent restrictions, the branch was unable to organize Yashwantrao Chavan Annual Memorial Lecture for the year 2021-2022.

### The Late Shri B.G. Deshmukh Annual Memorial Lecture:

Indian Institute of Public Administration, Maharashtra Regional Branch, Mumbai had organized the 7<sup>th</sup> Annual Late Shri B.G. Deshmukh Memorial Lecture, 2021-2022 on "Covid Management Team work —success story of Nandurbar District" by Dr. Rajendra Bharud, Ex. Collector Nandurbar on 23<sup>rd</sup> July, 2021 at 4.00 p.m. virtually.

Shri Swadheen Kshatriya, IAS, (Retd.) State Chief Commissioner, Right to Services, Maharashtra State & Hon. Chairman, IIPA/MRB chaired the programme. He welcomed the audience and introduced the guest speaker Dr. Rajendra Bharud. In his introductory speech he briefed about the Late Shri B.G. Deshmukh, one of India's most distinguished civil servants and former union Cabinet Secretary & former Chief Secretary, Government of Maharashtra.

Dr. Bharud talked about background of Nandurbar district & the challenges faced while dealing with Covid pandemic such as lack of health infrastructure, limited private health facilities, lack of medical college & testing facility, oxygen dependency, limited skilled manpower, dependency on Govt health facilities, illiteracy & lack of awareness among tribal majority people, etc.

Dr. Bharud made a detailed presentation of the steps taken to contain Covid-19 pandemic. He said district control Room has been set up with 4 separate helpline nos. & information related to beds, RTPCR test report, availability of ambulance is displayed on the website, dedicated hospital for women were established, considering the possibility of second wave, construction of Covid hospital was completed within 3 months, training given to newly recruited BAMS, BUMS doctors, 6 plants with capacity of 600 LPM were set up at different locations. He further said that the concept of oxygen nurse to curb wastage was introduced. One oxygen nurse per 50 patients was appointed to monitor use of oxygen & ensure minimal wastage.

Shri. S.N. Tripathi, Director General, IIPA was also present. He, while appreciating the work done by Dr. Bharud & his unique concept of oxygen nurse, said that whole of India should learn from this simple concept. He also proposed vote of thanks on behalf of IIPA & IIPA/MRB.

Training Programmes: Due to Covid-19 pandemic situation in the State, the training programmes could not be conducted 2021-2022.

### A. Essay Competition:

The Branch, every year organizes the Late Shri B.G. Deshmukh Annual Essay Competition for the public. The Branch, for the year 2021-2022, held the essay competition on the following topics..

### B. The Late Dr. S.S. Gadkari Memorial Award for Innovation in Public Administration:

The Branch received a donation of Rs.50,000/-from Ms. Sandhya Gadkari-Sharma d/o Late Dr. S.S. Gadkari, former Executive Joint Secretary IIPA/MRB, in March, 2015. As desired by the donor, a corpus fund of Rs. 50,000/- in the name of S.S. Gadkari has been set-up by the Branch.

The Branch has instituted "The Late Dr. S.S. Gadkari Annual Memorial Award for Innovation in Public Administration" since 2016.

This award is given to the public servant of the State Government who does excellent work on developing innovative ideas for delivering public service/public governance related to his/her office.

The criteria set for the award is primarily the employee having developed an idea which is innovative, by using the cutting-edge technology, which proved to be efficient, effective, time saving, transparent, citizen centric and hassle free for delivering the public service to the citizens. The innovation must be within the existing rules and regulations and office frame work. And the said innovative system should be adoptable and is being successfully implemented in the office.

A committee under the chairmanship of the Hon. Chairman, IIPA/MRB comprising- Hon. Secretary, IIPA/MRB and Additional Chief Secretary (Services), GAD-as members has been constituted for adjudging the proposals and selection of the nominee.

A prize of Rs.10,000/- and a certificate of appreciation is presented to the awardee.

Award for 2022: This is the seventh year of the award. The Branch had called nominations for this award from the heads of various departments of the State Government. The Branch had received a total of 7 proposals from various authorities of the State Government before the last date fixed for submitting the proposals. The committee met on 25.5.2022 to evaluate and adjudge the proposals received therefor. After careful scrutiny of the proposals and considering the criteria set for the award, the Committee recommended the proposal of Shri Ankit Goyal, I.P.S., S.P of Gadchiroli District about implementation of the "Gadchiroli Police Dadalora Khidki- Mava Hakka tha Khidki - Single Window scheme"

The Scheme is about providing various welfare schemes/services of the Govt. to the tribal population living in remote areas. This scheme is being implemented by the police personnel by going beyond the call of their duty.

Gadchiroli is one of the worst affected districts by violent left-wing extremism (LWE) in the country. Delivery of Public Services in this district has to face several unique challenges which include inter-alia difficult Geographic terrain, 75.96% area is covered by dense forest, poor connectivity and lack of awareness about Govt. Schemes among tribal population. To overcome these challenges and to bring one window solution to under-reached population, Police Dadalora khidki-Mava Hakka tha Khidki was conceptualized at all the 50 deep outposts of the districts. Public approaches the single window system, relevant documents are collected, copied and attached to the requisite forms of the schemes and dispatched online or offline by the team of Dadalora Khidki. A separate team pursues the departments concerned and ensures that entitlements are received by the citizen. As a result, till January 2022 more than 1.25 lakh people have been benefited in various ways like Caste certificate, certificates related to identity like disability, job cards, driving licenses etc., beneficiaries of various govt. schemes, training to youth in various skills, distribution of free saplings, seeds at concessional rates etc. It is a wonderful innovation.

Shri Ankit Goyal, I.P.S., S.P of Gadchiroli District has in addition to his duty of maintaining law & order, set up system to provide delivery of public services and schemes to the tribal people in the remote areas of the District. It is a wonderful innovation.

The award is to be presented in the 67th AGM of the Branch.
