The 65th Annual General Meeting of Indian Institute of Public Administration, Maharashtra Regional Branch, Mumbai was held virtually on 9th February, 2021 at 3.30pm. Shri Swadheen Kshatriya, IAS (Retd.) Hon. Chairman, IIPA/MRB presided over the meeting.

The proceedings of the meeting were conducted as per the scheduled agenda. The gist of the meeting is as follows:

The meeting adopted the Annual Report of the year 2019-2020. The meeting after due deliberation adopted the financial statements comprising the Balance Sheet as at 31st March, 2020, and the Income and Expenditure account for the year 2019-2020 and notes to the financial Statements, Including a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information notes for the year 2019-2020 along with balance sheet as on 31.3.2020 .

The meeting appreciated the work done by the firm M/s Sharp and Tannan, Chartered Accountants, Mumbai and resolved that M/s Sharp and Tannan, Chartered Accountants, Mumbai be continued as auditors of Branch for the financial year 2020-2021.

The meeting also resolved that the remuneration of the auditing firm M/s Sharp and Tannan, Chartered Accountants, Mumbai be raised from Rs.10,000/- to Rs.20,000/- for auditing the accounts of the Branch for the year 2020-2021.

The Chairman also requested the auditing firm that the firm should along with filing of Income Tax Returns of the Branch, the requisite compliance i.e. furnishing of online audit report of the Branch to the Charity Commissioner's office also be done.

Prelude Conference 2021:

Prelude Conference: Institute of Public Administration, Maharashtra Regional Branch, Mumbai Organized a prelude conference on "Management of Pandemic" the topic proposed by IIPA, New Delhi on 26th February, 2021 at 3.30 pm virtually.

Shri Swadheen Kshatriya, IAS, (Retd.) Hon. Chairman, IIPA, MRB presided over the meeting. He introduced the guest speaker Shri Suresh Kakani, IAS, Additional Commissioner, Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation.

Shri Suresh Kakani, IAS, made presentation on the subject. He described in detail the MCGM's response to control COVID-19 in the city of Mumbai. India's first case of COVID-19 was confirmed on 30th January the first patient of COVID-19 was isolated on March 10,2020 in the Kasturba Hospital for infectious Diseases.

He described how the Pandemic control and management requires evidence based strategic, strong leadership and administrative commitment, team building and coordination in the field at various levels, multi holder involvement and establishing institutional mechanisms. The participants appreciated the administrative management work done by the BMC for containing the pandemic situation in the Brihanmumbai Corporation area and also the measures that are being undertaken to provide medical facilities for vaccination of the targeted population.

Lectures/Meetings etc.:

Yashwantrao Chavan Annual Memorial Lecture:

Due to Covid-19 pandemic situation and the consequent lock-down & the restrictions, the branch was unable to organize Yashwantrao Chavan Annual Memorial Lecture for the year 2020-2021.

The Late Shri B.G. Deshmukh Annual Memorial Lecture:

Indian Institute of Public Administration, Maharashtra Regional Branch, Mumbai had organized the 6th Annual Late Shri B.G. Deshmukh Memorial Lecture, 2020-2021 on "Administrative Reforms, 1990-2021" by Shri V. Srinivas, IAS, Additional Secretary, Ministry of Personnel, PG & Pension Department of Administrative Reforms & Public Grievances, Government of India, on 22.3.2021 at 4p.m. virtually.

Shri Swadheen Kshatriya, IAS, (Retd.) State Chief Commissioner, Right to Services, Maharashtra State & Hon. Chairman, IIPA/MRB chaired the programme and welcomed the audience and introduced the guest speaker Shri V. Srinivas. In his introductory speech he briefed about the Late Shri B.G. Deshmukh, one of India's most distinguished civil servants and former Cabinet Secretary & former Chief Secretary, Government of Maharashtra. He also talked about the prior lectures held in the B.G. Deshmukh memorial lecture series.

Shri V. Srinivas talked about the principal areas of administrative reforms in public administration of the country should be accountable and citizen friendly, it must ensue transparency and endow citizens with RTI and also promote integrity in public services and motivate civil service. The public administration must be result oriented and improve its performance.

Mr. Srinivas made detailed presentation of the Administrative Reforms in India since Independence.

He divided his presentation into two parts. First part covered the period 1950 to 1990 including the Santhanam Committee, Kothari Committee, Satish Chandra Committee. Major part of his presentation was on reforms in post-Liberalization Era Since 1990s. These reforms were driven by economic liberalization. He concluded by presenting the Good Governance index 2019 and the National e-Governance Service Delivery Assessment 2019 and the three critical new institutions -Lok Pal, GST Council and NitiAayog.

The lecture was very brilliantly articulated. It covered all the aspects of evolution of development governance, Public administration and policies for public welfare.

Shri V. Srinivas also interacted with the audience and addressed the queries.

Training Programmes: Due to Covid-19 pandemic situation and the consequent lockdown enforced in the State, the training programmes could not be conducted during 2020-2021.

Other Activities:

A. Essay Competition: The Branch, every year organizes the Late Shri B.G. Deshmukh Annual Essay Competition for the public. The Branch, for the year 2020-2021, held the essay competition on the following topics including one indicated by IIPA, New Delhi.

- 1) Covid and Public Health System Management; (proposed by IIPA. New Delhi)
- 2) Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalayan Yojana and its implementation in Maharashtra State.
- 3) Housing for every one under prime ministers Aawas Yojna and its implementation in Maharashtra State.

The total 13 participants took part in the competition. Out of these, entries of 11 participants were found to be valid. The essays were adjudged by the panel constituted under the chairmanship of Shri S.V. Joshi comprising Shri V.V. Deodhar and Dr. P.R. Kondekar as the members. The Essay Evaluation Committee met on 7.9. 2021 for confirming the meritorious entries of the essays received for the essay competition 2020-2021. B. The Late Dr. S.S. Gadkari Memorial Award for Innovation in Public Administration:

The Branch received a donation of Rs.50,000/-from Ms. Sandhya Gadkari-Sharma d/o Late Dr. S.S. Gadkari, former Executive Joint Secretary IIPA/MRB, in March, 2015. As desired by the donor, a corpus fund of Rs. 50,000/- in the name of S.S. Gadkari has been set-up by the Branch.

The Branch has instituted "The Late Dr. S.S. Gadkari Annual Memorial Award for Innovation in Public Administration" since 2016.

This award is given to the public servant of the State Government who does excellent work on developing innovative ideas for delivering public service/public governance related to his/her office.

The criteria set for the award is primarily the employee having developed an idea which is innovative, by using the cutting-edge technology, which proved to be efficient, effective, time saving, transparent, citizen centric and hassle free for delivering the public service to the citizens. The innovation must be within the existing rules and regulations and office frame work. And the said innovative system should be adoptable and is being successfully implemented in the office.

A committee under the chairmanship of the Hon. Chairman, IIPA/MRB comprising - Hon. Secretary, IIPA/MRB and Additional Chief Secretary (Services), GAD-as members has been constituted for adjudging the proposals and selection of the nominee.

A prize of Rs.10,000/- and a certificate of appreciation is presented to the awardee. We also reimburse travelling expenses (limited to A/C three tier Railway or A/C Bus fare) to the outstation awardee.

Award for 2021: This is the sixth year of the award. The Branch had called nominations for this award from the heads of various departments of the State Government. The Branch had received a total of 5 proposals from various authorities of the State Government before the last date fixed for submitting the proposals. The committee met on 5.1.2021 to evaluate and adjudge the proposals received therefor. After careful scrutiny of the proposals and considering the criteria set for the award, the Committee recommended the proposal of Shri Suraj Mandhare, IAS, Collector & District Magistrate, Nashik about implementation of the Maharashtra Right to Public service Act, 2015 in Nashik district by notifying 81 more services over and above the 20 mandatory services notified by the Government for Revenue Department is unique and innovative.

Nashik is the only district in the State which has notified 81 additional services. These services are major, vital & also very useful for rural as well as urban citizens such as Domicile Certificate, Caste certificate, Income certificate, Non-creamy layer certificate, mutation entries, certified copies of record of rights, certificate of land less agricultural laborer, old age pension scheme, Widow pension scheme, etc. These services cover entire population rural as well as urban. These services has received over whelming response from the general public. As a result during a short span of six months 11 lakhs services have been delivered to the citizens in stipulated time.

Hon chairman mentioned that he had gone to Nashik & seen its implementation. The best part of it is the monitoring mechanism. All the online services are being monitored through centralized portal and for monitoring offline services a proforma has been prescribed to field officers. It is a wonderful innovation & is replicable in the entire State. The award is to be presented in the ensuing 66th AGM of the Branch.

C. Library:

The Branch has well-maintained library having more than 13000 books on various subjects of Public Administration including Economics, Political Science, Sociology, Management, History, Biographies of eminent personalities and books written by Service and defense personnel.

We would like to bring to the notice of the members that the library of IIPA,MRB was closed from 22.03.2020 to 6.10.2020 due to declaration of lockdown due to COVID-19 pandemic. After resumption of work of the Branch, it was found that the Mantralaya premises was flooded due to heavy rains on 4-5 June, 2020, which has caused damage to the library books & Desktops. Around 3000 books were found to be affected with the flood and termite infestation. Weeding, drying, pest controlling, cleaning of books- these measures were undertaken to retrieve the affected books by employing extra manpower to overcome the situation. Hon.

Chairman & Hon. Secretary visited the office on 3.11.2020 & 9.11.2020 respectively and reviewed the damage and gave instructions for recovery of the affected books. As per the guidance of the Hon. Chairman, the Asiatic Society was requested to send an expert from the society who is well conversant with conservation of books. Dr. Usha R Vijailakshmi, officiating Hon. Secretary of the Asiatic Society deputed Shri Sunil Bhirud, Conservation Supervisor, to visit the library. Shri Bhirud paid visit to the library on 9.11.2020 and made valuable suggestions regarding systematic method of recovery of affected books. After following the guidance and method suggested by Shri Bhirud for conserving the affected books, we could retrieve most of the affected books. However approximately 450 book have been totally damaged which will be written off with the approval of Library committee.

D. The IIPA/MRB had sponsored the research project on "The problem of Urban Transportation in Metropolitan area of Mumbai in Maharashtra" and had requested the MMRDA to undertake research project. Accordingly MMRDA has completed the research project and submitted the project report to IIPA/MRB vide its letter dated 17.3.2021.




